Entry Criteria

Virgin Blue Business Awards

- **Best Specific Environmental Initiative**
- **Environmental Best Practice Program**

This Award category is open to all Australian business and industry sectors, and aims to recognise the work of those businesses that are working towards a more sustainable and environmentally responsible future through the implementation and development of specific environmental initiatives and/or overall management. These Awards also recognise initiatives undertaken in partnership with local communities and environmental organisations.

An array of cleaner, greener production techniques and innovative technological and practical solutions are being developed and a growing market for their application has become evident. Businesses are also integrating environmental considerations into their work practices in the quest to reduce their overall environmental impact, ecological footprint and achieve more environmentally sustainable development.

1. Award for Best Specific Environmental Initiative

This Award invites nominations that relate to specific environmental initiatives or projects. Possible examples include: recycling; waste management, minimisation or pollution reduction strategies; energy or water conservation measures; use of renewable or alternative energy sources; research and development; cradle to grave production techniques; and community partnerships/alliances and involvement in supporting local conservation or re-vegetation projects.

2. Award for Environmental Best Practice Program

This Award invites nominations which showcase excellence in overall management or activities at a whole-of-business level, in relation to environmental considerations. By following a path of economic development that safeguards the environment and associated welfare of future generations, business and industry sectors have a very significant role to play in the arena of environmental protection and sustainable development. This award seeks to recognize the endeavors of those companies which support new ideas and produce new standards and acknowledge those business leaders who actively demonstrate an awareness of their environmental responsibilities.

Method of Entry:

Entries must be submitted in hard copy print format, and may include photographic, CD or DVD evidence to illustrate and describe the project, person or initiative. Multiple entries are acceptable. However, to be eligible for judging, an official entry form and the appropriate entry fee must accompany each individual category entered.

A nomination form for the United Nations Association of Australia World Environment Day Awards 2010 is attached below. Please read the instructions below, complete the Nomination Form and attach it to the front of your entry. **Electronic submissions will not be accepted.**

Nomination Checklist

Before mailing your nomination please check you have enclosed the following documents for each individual entry.

1. A completed Nomination Form for each award for which you have nominated.
2. Three hard copies of a typed submission, no longer than 2,000 words, which covers the entry criteria for each award entered.
3. Three hard copies of a one page synopsis summarising your entry.
4. A selection of three colour or black/white photographs relating to the environmental project and/or people involved in the project. (These items will not be returned, but arrangements can be made to collect them from our office)
5. Any media materials (CD/DVD/ Print article) relevant to your entry.
6. Your entry fee Cheque made out to: "United Nations Association of Australia, Victoria", if you have not already paid by Visa or MasterCard on your nomination form.

If you are entering the Media/Environmental Reporting Award category the date and publication/program in which the piece was published, or went to air, must be specified. The following materials must also be provided:

7(a). Print:

Three copies of the published article for each award entered. (These can be good quality photocopies instead of originals).

7(b). Radio

One CD of the program for each award entered.

7(c). Television

One DVD of the program for each award entered.
